The April 29th concert, titled, *We Can Be Heroes* invites families to meet the super heroes of the Orchestra in an afternoon of sing-alongs to music from *Frozen* and *Moana*, dancing to music by Beethoven and Mozart and a conducting lesson to *Star Wars* music. Broadway star and local darling, Susan Egan, will be a guest artist, and the concert will be led by Music Director Eckart Preu. Audiences are encouraged to come dressed in their favorite hero costume.
